One of the major projects of the Princeton Photography Club throughout the year is to mount multiple art exhibitions at several local galleries. These exhibitions are a great way for the public to learn about our Club and to see our excellent work and that of other local artists. These exhibitions are publicized in local newspapers to gain the Club and our members' work a wider audience. They do, however, require a great deal of planning, coordination, and physical labor. At the Lakefront Gallery at RWJ Hospital Hamilton, for example, we have hung up to 90 artworks in the course of one day.

The group of Club members who regularly show up to help hang the artwork is small and we could use a

few more people to assist. The work involves receiving and unwrapping artwork, arranging the pieces along the length of the gallery, securely hanging them, and then accurately labeling each piece.

Learn about the **environmental photography of Adam Ekberg**. Placing everyday objects in unusual settings and combining that with implausible situations, Adam presents us with imaginative images, all recorded on film with little or no post-processing manipulation. He will be joined by his wife, **Katherine Bussard**, Peter C. Bunnell Curator of Photography, Princeton University Art Museum.

Ekberg talks about his “longing to see things in the world that are unlikely or impossible,” and his ability to actualize that goal takes incredible patience and ingenuity. There is something of the early days of photography here, when its practitioners were experimenting constantly to see what they could capture on film. Ekberg captivates the viewer by setting up and executing miraculous moments, and there seems to be no limit to his imagination.

Coming off the successful collaboration between the PPC and the Princeton University Art Museum with the presentation by Stephen Shore last April, another major photographer will be discussing her work one evening at the University.

For more than a decade, **South African photographer Zanele Muholi** has created a visual record of black lesbian women in her home country. In 2006, Muholi began her Faces and Phases project, an ambitious series of bold, undeniably powerful portraits made against plain or patterned backgrounds—now numbering around three hundred—and often exhibited in tightly arranged grids. “Faces and Phases,” published by Steidl last fall, forms a monumental chapter in Muholi’s mission to remedy black queer invisibility. That project as well as more recent work will be the focus of her talk.

Last year, the audience packed the room. So plan to arrive early.
