

Through the Lens

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Danielle Austen to present on Wednesday, March 8

Danielle Austen is an award winning documentary fine art photographer specializing in environmental portraits of nature. Danielle was trained in the traditional fine arts of painting, sculpture, drawing and photography where she received her BFA from Cornell University. She worked as a graphic designer before attending the master's program at the Syracuse University's S.I. Newhouse School of Public Communications, in photojournalism.

Working for newspapers and magazines, her editorial work has been published locally, regionally and nationally, including the 2002 issue of "Life's, The Year in Pictures." Returning to her fine art roots, she has combined her skills and training and has participated in more than two dozen national juried exhibits, and recently had a joint show at the Atrium Gallery in Morristown, NJ. Last year she was an Artist-in-Residence at the Everglades National Park and received a Fellowship from the Vermont Studio Center. Most recently, Danielle was the juror for the Focus on Sculpture Exhibition at the Grounds for Sculpture.

Her presentation will be on "Long Exposures in Nature Photography". Long exposure photography is about capturing, and translating movement within a frame. Using the technique of long exposures in nature photography has the ability to take your images in a new creative direction, by exploring the interplay of light, patterns, and tones. The effects can be surreal, and even ethereal. Take more control of your camera by using manual mode and understand the skills and accessories needed to achieve your

goals.
