**Do you mean "Members News" or "Members News" ...?**

Since its inception, the Newsletter has shared its name with the *Members News* webpage. In hindsight, that was one bad idea from your editor. The two entities have much overlapping content, but they have evolved differently under different masters. The newsletter is current, aimed at members, and, written in a familiar style. It delivers unbridled support and encouragement to exhibiting members. The webpage speaks to the world. It serves as a record of our individual achievements. True, most images pass through the Newsletter on their way to the webpage, but the webmaster also uses other sources. Understandably, two entities with the same name and similar content has contributed to some confusion. Web-directed comments have arrived at the newsletter editors inbox, and vice versa we are sure.

Time for a fix! Webmaster Olga Sergyeyeva and Newsletter Editor Jerry Gerber have agreed to change the name of the webpage, while keeping the *Members News* banner on the Newsletter. At very least, having different names for different things makes sense, and will eliminate the frequent need for explanatory text accompanying the words "Members News." We expect the webpage name-change to occur soon. Look for it.



For Newer Members (and Any Who May Not Have Been Paying Attention)

We don't look for stories. They have to find us.

If you will be exhibiting, we would love to tell the club about it, and help boost attendance at your show. But first you have to tell us what you are up to. It gives us a sense of pride when fellow PPC members are active in the photographic community. Big-city gallery or local library, it doesn't matter. If your images will be on public display, win awards, or appear in a publication, we are happy and proud to share that news with the membership and others.

Send us a sample jpeg or two, in an *informal* e-mail telling us the essentials--the who, what, where, and when of the exhibit, award, or publication. Oh, and don't sweat the writing-- that's our job. If you can, add some details. Tell us how many of your images will be on display, the theme of the exhibit, how many images were submitted and how many were accepted. Items like those can increase reader interest (and attendance).

See the *Submission Guidelines* at the end of every issue, then write us if you have questions, concerns, or just need some handholding.



Submission Guidelines

Read the bullets below, then **SHARE NEWS** of your photography awards, exhibitions, publications, and other acknowledgments of merit by sending *your* story and images *directly* to the Newsletter Editor:

- Name your image files in the format: Lastname_Firstname_ImageTitle.jpg. Images can be any size greater than 250 pixels in height.
- Understand that what you send will be edited and distributed by email and/or posted on the PPC web site.
- Please do not send us material that is copyrighted, or wholly or partly created by others. We do not knowingly publish those.
- It usually takes one to two weeks for your news to appear in print. It will often be more or less.
- If you want your story to appear here, tell the editor about it yourself.
- We try to get it right. If we err, we owe only a correction.
