Coming Up at PPC's Next Meeting



Our next PPC meeting, **February 12**, will feature "African American Landscape, Architecture and Artifacts: a Photographic Journey", with speaker **Wendel White**.

Wendel A. White was born in Newark, New Jersey and grew up in New York, Pennsylvania, and New Jersey. He was awarded a BFA in photography from the School of Visual Arts in New York and an MFA in photography from the University

of Texas at Austin. White taught photography at the School of Visual Arts, NY; The Cooper Union for the Advancement of Science and Art, NY; the International Center for Photography, NY; Rochester Institute of Technology; and is currently Distinguished Professor of Art at The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey.

He has received various awards and fellowships including a John Simon Guggenheim Foundation Fellowship in Photography, two artist fellowships from the New Jersey State Council for the Arts, a photography grant from the Graham Foundation for Advanced Studies in the Fine Arts, and a New Works Photography Fellowship from En Foco Inc.

His work is represented in museum and corporate collections including: En Foco, New York, NY; Rochester Institute of Technology, NY; the Museum of Fine Art, Houston, TX; Museum of Contemporary Photography, Chicago, IL; Haverford College, PA; Johnson and Johnson, New Brunswick, NJ; Chase Manhattan Bank; the Paul R. Jones Collection of African American Art at University of Delaware; Haggerty Museum of Art at Marquette University, WI; and the NYPL Schomburg Center for Research in Black Culture, NY. In January 2003, the Noyes Museum of Art

mounted a retrospective exhibition of the *Small Towns, Black Lives* project, including 13 years of images and an exhibition catalogue of the same title.

White has served on the board of directors for the Society for Photographic Education, three years as board chair. He has also served on the Kodak Educational Advisory Council, NJ Save Outdoor Sculpture, the Atlantic City Historical Museum, and the New Jersey Black Culture and Heritage Foundation. White has been a board member, including three years as board chair, of the New Jersey Council for the Humanities.

His current projects include, Schools for the Colored, and Manifest

MN Submission Guidelines

When preparing images for submission to the newsletter, it is no longer necessary to add the Title and you name below the image. To keep the size and format of this information consistent for all images, the MN editor will add this information when preparing the newsletter.

What to Send

- Images and timely news about your own upcoming exhibits, publications, and other
 public events, such as photography lectures or classes you will be teaching. If possible,
 include an exhibition announcement with your image.
- Non-exhibition images from members who seldom exhibit. These will be published on an as-needed basis. Send us work you are most proud of!
- Links to members' own photography websites for inclusion in the PPC Members'
 Websites list.

How to Send:

- Images should be sent as .ipg
- Resize images to 240 pixels height, with 100 dpi resolution.

Send details:

Please give us accurate information. Tell us everything that an uninformed reader would need to attend your event or acquire your publication. For exhibitions and award ceremonies, give us the details, such as *venue name and address*, *contact information*, *website*, *opening and closing dates*, *opening reception*, *exhibit times*, *event fees*, *etc*.

For publications, tell us *publication name, cover-date or volume, and in-store date,* as known. Extra information is better than too little!

If you have multiple images selected for a show, the MN Newsletter editor <u>may show only</u> <u>one</u> if the show occurs during a time when many members are also having multiple images selected. With over 200 superb artists in our club, we may not always be able to print all images.

<u>We respect copyright laws</u>. Please <u>do not send</u> material that is copyrighted or wholly or partly created by others. We do not publish magazine or book pages, web pages, or materials owned or created by others.

When To Send

- September through June: submit date-sensitive information three weeks before the event to ensure timely coverage.
- July through September: give a *minimum* of three weeks. If you can't give us that much lead, send your item anyway. Sometimes it works.

What We'll Do With Your Submission

Your text may be edited or completely rewritten for style, format, and content. If necessary, your image will be re-sized and processed to the *MN* standard format.

When We Goof (yes, it happens...)

We try to get it right. If we err and you let us know, we'll print a correction in a subsequent issue.
